<b>Day 1</b> Thursday 21 March	NEWCASTLE to HOLBROOK	MT - D
Accommodation	Byer Fountain Motor Inn, Holbrook	

7:30am Depart Kings Depot. Pick up points are available at Charlestown, Belmont North, Belmont, Swansea, Doyalson and Ourimbah by arrangement at the time of your booking. Welcome aboard Kings of Newcastle Coach ready for a 7-day tour, including the Melbourne International Flower Show. Depart Kings Coach Depot at This world-renowned flower and garden show is regarded as the largest and most successful horticultural event in the Southern Hemisphere. Today we travel via Sydney to Holbrook for our first night on tour, stopping along the way for convenience stops and to purchase lunch. On arrival we can check-in and freshen up before dinner.



<b>Day 2</b> Friday 22 March	HOLBROOK to WERRIBEE	B – L – D

Following an early breakfast, we travel slightly off the highway to discover the gourmet region of Milawa, starting with a visit to the Olive Shop, at the tasting counter there are local olives, olive oils and olive oil-based dressings to sample. Next, we visit Milawa Cheese for a tasting. Keeping with the fabulous food theme of the region our last visit in the area is to Milawa Mustards, located in the Old Emu Inn building. Our lunch today has been arranged in the quiet rural township of Whorouly at Remel 185. The 'tobacco shed' which once stored dried tobacco piled to the ceiling and bales ready for 'sale day' has been transformed into a Dining Area, the 'grading shed' where many hours were once spent sorting those golden coloured leaves, is now the Kitchen, where again many hours are spent, but now to produce an array of wonderful foods, and the 'kilns' have remained in their original form and are well used as storage space. This afternoon sit back and relax as we express through to Werribee. On arrival we can settle into our accommodation and unpack as this will be home for the next four nights.

<b>Day 3</b> Saturday 23 March	WERRIBEE	B – D

We have arranged a visit to the **Werribee Open Range Zoo**. The zoo has a special focus on African animals so we'll board our special safari bus to take a tour amongst some of the world's iconic grassland animals. We will be completely immersed in the sights, smells and sounds of the savannah as we travel across the Zoo's open plains. The magnificent wildlife, including rhinos, giraffes, zebras and antelopes will seem almost touchable. After our tour we have some free time to enjoy a stroll along the walking tracks to see other animals such as the Meerkats. Departing the Zoo we have a short distance to drive to our afternoon visit at the **Werribee Park Mansion**. The mansion has long been regarded as Victoria's finest rural homestead. Completed in 1877 it was built in the Italianate style by pioneering pastoralists, the Chirnside brothers from Scotland. On arrival we will be given an introduction to the mansion before enjoying a self-guided tour at our own pace. We also have plenty of time to enjoy the formal gardens including a stroll through the **State Rose Garden**, featuring 4500 plants from 100 species in the shape of a giant Tudor rose.





<b>Day 4</b> Sunday 24 March	INTERNATIONAL FLOWER SHOW	B – D

What a day to be exploring flowers and gardens, I hope you have your green thumbs ready for the International Flower and Garden Show. This show is a hallmark event for Victoria and the most prestigious of its kind in Australia. Over 300 exhibits are on show representing horticulture, nurseries, landscape gardening, floristry and cut flowers together with their associated products and services. The show will simply take your breath away with the work of Australia's leading floral designers creating exquisite feature displays. We have plenty of time to spend here today. In fact, the whole day is available for the show. We make a time to meet later today to return to our hotel.





<b>Day 5</b> Monday 25 March	AROUND PORT PHILLIP BAY	B – L – D

We depart Werribee and head around to the bay where we have a ferry to catch from Queenscliff to Sorrento, back on land we uncover Australia's oldest and most famous hedge maze at Ashcombe Maze and Lavender Gardens. We have time to wander the year-round flowering lavender labyrinth and 25 acres of world acclaimed gardens before lunch. Shortly after we arrive at Red Hill Estate, a multi award winning winery situated in the internationally recognised "cool climate" region. This stunning property also boasts superb panoramic views of Westernport Bay which we will enjoy as we indulge in a wine tasting. This afternoon we soar the heights of the Mornington Peninsula gliding through the sky in a gondola at Arthurs Sea Eagle. With uninterrupted views across Port Phillip Bay and framed by swaying gum trees, we'll be impressed by the magic landscape. We return to the ferry for our return journey to Queenscliff. After an enjoyable day we have some time to freshen up before dinner in the hotel.

Following our lovely stay in Werribee we make our way to one more garden, **Alowyn Gardens** which started life as a blackberry infested paddock.
