Day 1 Wednesday 11 th March	NEWCASTLE to NORFOLK ISLAND	D

4:30am Depart Kings Coach Depot for Sydney Airport. Pick up points are available at Charlestown, Belmont North, Belmont, Swansea, Doyalson and Ourimbah by arrangement at the time of your booking. **9:45am** Fly out from Sydney Airport to Norfolk island.


Arrive on the island early afternoon where we are met by a representative from **Pinetree Tours.** We will be welcomed to the Island then transferred to our accommodation at the **Paradise Hotel & Resort.** Set in lush subtropical gardens with mountain and valley views, we have the perfect surroundings to ease ourselves into our environment. The resort is in the township of Burnt Pine so we can wander through the shops during our free time. Dinner at the Hotel.



Day 2 Thursday 12 th March	NORFOLK ISLAND	B – D
Accommodation	Paradise Hotel & Resort, Norfolk Island	

Today we are collected by Baunti Escapes for the **Discover Our World tour.** We will be introduced to the island to set the scene for our stay. Our tour includes a visit to the convict buildings in historic **Kingston** and **St Barnabas Chapel**, built from the ruins of the New Gaol. They'll briefly commentate on the early island and people's history as well as the current day environment. Late afternoon we head to the western side of the island for the wonderful **Island Fish Feast Dinner**. Perched on the clifftop above Anson Bay we will have an eagle-eyed view of the tiny crescent shaped beach and the magnificent spread of ocean stretching to the far horizon. We'll enjoy paddock to plate freshness including local fish, Prepared the local way! We'll be entertained by an entertainer and Tahitian-style dancers. On conclusion we return to our resort.

Following breakfast, we have the morning at leisure before our afternoon touring from Emily Bay where we take in the unique **Glass Bottomed Boat tour**. Our guide will share their knowledge of Norfolk's marine life and once we've "walked the plank" with these 'mutineer descendants' it takes a minute to get to the reef. Here we're able to view beautiful coral gardens and tropical fish inside the calm crystal waters of Norfolk's lagoon. This afternoon we will embark on the **Convict Settlement Tour**. This is an 'In Depth' Tour of the historic Georgian settlement of Kingston. Walk through the cemetery & hear the history of interesting convict and colonial headstones. Including the ruins of the New Gaol; visit All Saints Church which was, in convict times, the Commissariat Store.



We dress as convicts and along with the Commandant, we are in for an evening of gaiety, feasting and singing. Our convict outfits are issued to us for the evening!! Great food! Great fun!





Day 4 Saturday 14 th March	NORFOLK ISLAND	B – D

We have a different breakfast setting this morning as we are taken on a gentle-paced walk through a diverse habitat from rainforest to the Captain Cook Memorial. As we ramble along the track our guide will identify local grasses, ferns, shrubs as well as bird species. It will be a wonderful way to start our day. This afternoon we delve into the rich culture and heritage of our forebears on the **Island Culture Tour**. Where the arts of weaving, cooking, dancing and the Norfolk Language were inherited from our mutineer ancestors and their Tahitian wives. Join us for a cooking demonstration, indulge in a taste of some traditional dishes, master Tahitian Island dancing, try your hand at weaving and attempt some of the Norf'k Language. Following dinner, we travel into the bushland of Norfolk Island. It is here that we are treated to a **Wonderland By Night**. The setting is 10 acres of magical Norfolk pines and bushland lit up like an enchanted forest. We'll meander along (or ride in the 'Moon Buggy') a winding pathway. Afterwards we enjoy a light supper.

Day 5 Sunday 15 th March	NORFOLK ISLAND	B – L – D

This morning we will enjoy breakfast at the Hotel before some free time to explore the Markets and local areas. Lunch has been provided today. After lunch we will have time to explore Fletcher Mutiny's Cyclorama. The Cyclorama provides a total experience, bringing to life the history of the Norfolk Island people and their connection with the infamous mutiny on the 'Bounty'. After the Cyclorama you have time to visit the Queen Victoria's Gardens. This afternoon we will visit the Bounty Museum where we discover the amazing story of Norfolk Island in this quirky museum. The Bounty Museum is a treasure chest of history, an Aladdin's cave full of fantastic



collections, excellent learning resources and inspiring information stretching back to 1788.

As a civic museum for the island of Norfolk, the Bounty Museum chronicles the history of the island and provides visitors with an intimate and informative glimpse into life on Norfolk Island during this time. Dinner at the Hotel.

Day 6 Monday 16 th March	NORFOLK ISLAND	B – L – D

After breakfast we join the **Norfolk Today Tour**. We'll learn how Norfolk Islanders live in the 21st century and make life on this tiny South Pacific Island possible. How is petrol and gas brought to the island? How is the island powered? This is a behind the scenes tour where we'll meet the locals and see how Norfolk plays a role in the worldwide weather monitoring as well as visiting the community radio station. Our afternoon tour **Paddock to Plate** where we will visit a market garden that supplies vegetables to the Island and learn about providing seasonal produce. We'll also tour a farm with beef cattle to understand the unique farming practices on Norfolk Island. Next, we'll visit a free-range chicken farm and learn how they supply the Island with farm fresh eggs. Dinner at the Hotel.

Day 7 Tuesday 17 th March	NORFOLK ISLAND	B – D

Following breakfast will tour the property of the late **Colleen McCullough**. The world-renowned author of 24 books called Norfolk Island home for almost 36 years and today we have the opportunity to see into her world. She and husband, Norfolk Islander, Ric Robinson, created a luxurious hideaway and maintained their privacy to ensure that Colleen had the perfect environment for her writing. Some of her most powerful titles were created in this much-loved sanctuary. Her beloved property "Out Yenna" is now open, and we are escorted through her magnificent home where we are able to view Ric and Colleen's priceless collection of artefacts gathered on their travels all over the world. We have some free time for lunch and our immersion into local life continues this afternoon with our visit to the **Pitcairn Settlers Village**. We'll experience what life was like for Norfolk Island's most recent settlers, the Pitcairners and their descendants at one of the last few remaining original settler's properties. Light refreshments are included during our tour. Tonight, we freshen up for an evening of meeting the locals on the **Progressive Dinner**. This is the perfect way to get a taste of the real Norfolk lifestyle.
